From March 20 to April 20 answered 98,689 calls in our call centers

2 Citizens were charged with tax evasion and 1 person who was previously charged, was arrested for failing to show up for their court date

Over 80% of MVED renewals (dealership, sales person, body shop, dismantler) are being processed on-line. We are allowing dealerships to renew all of their salespersons

We have 17 employees working on the Covid-19 tracing project

All preliminary values for centrally assessed properties need to be completed by May 1. We are currently at about 80% complete
